FROM THE GRANTS COMMITTEE: VOTE ON 2009 GRANTEES

At the May 13th general meeting, AAWGT members will select the grantees for our third annual grant cycle. A total of \$64,500 in funding is available for local projects, and each grantee will be awarded up to \$10,000 for the year. Those who were members of AAWGT in 2008 and/or 2009 are eligible to vote. The meeting will be held at the Edgewater Police Station Community Room, 35 Stepney Road, from 8:30-10:00 AM.

About a week before the meeting, each member will receive an email packet consisting of a ballot with finalists recommended by the Grants Committee and a confidential summary of each proposal. The packet will also include instructions for submitting an absentee ballot if you are unable to attend the meeting.

The list of finalists is the product of the efforts of six review teams, consisting of 26 AAWGT reviewers. The process began in January when we sent out 100 solicitations to non-profit organizations working in Anne Arundel County. Later that month the Grants Committee held information sessions for the non-profit organizations and training sessions for new reviewers. By the February 12th deadline for proposals, AAWGT had received 29 applications, representing requests for almost \$260,000 in funding. At this point the actual review of the applications began, and members of the review teams were at the heart of that process. Each team, consisting of four or five trained AAWGT members, reviewed and ranked a set of randomly selected proposals. They read and analyzed the grants, discussed applications, conducted site visits (where necessary), and made the difficult decisions required to select the finalists. Great care was taken to avoid conflicts of interest. Now the AAWGT membership will determine which programs will be awarded grants for 2009.

Please look for the ballot packet in your email. We on the Grants Committee look forward to seeing you at the meeting and counting your votes!
